# Increasing the safety of women and girls

#### Oranga Tamariki operating model - implications for women

We have commented on the first in a series of draft Cabinet papers on the new operating model for Oranga Tamariki - Ministry for Children. The first paper, *The future direction of the intensive intervention function for Oranga Tamariki – Ministry for Children,* proposes an intensive intervention core function for Oranga Tamariki. This proposed function aims to reduce the risk of harm and prevent entry and re-entry into state care for children at risk of harm.

The paper has implications for women as primary carers: the effectiveness of the proposed intensive intervention function for children will be improved by policies that support women's economic independence, safety and wellbeing. We have suggested that the paper explicitly identifies these implications.

We will watch this paper and coming papers closely and provide advice to you as needed.

#### International Women's Caucus


On Tuesday 5 June the Ministry hosted the International Women's Caucus. The meeting included an update on the Gender Pay Principles launch, to be held in Parliament on Monday 2 July, and Caucus members were invited to attend. MFAT officials provided an update on UN Resolution 1325: Women, Peace and Security, and on trade and gender. Under-Secretary Logie attended the afternoon session, which focused on preparations for the CEDAW examination in July. Civil society Caucus members shared their priorities for CEDAW in a round-table discussion. The next Caucus meeting will be held in late August and we will invite Acting Minister for Women Eugenie Sage to attend.
