Sharing the load report released

Westpac New Zealand released a report this week, *Sharing the load, looking at the division of unpaid work inside households*. The findings are based on an online survey of 2,421 New Zealanders conducted in October 2020. The report found that:

- sharing housework and care responsibilities more equally could increase the size of New Zealand's economy by \$1.5 billion on average every year, representing approximately 0.5 percent of New Zealand GDP
- the division of labour remains gendered in New Zealand household: men typically do most of the paid work, while women undertake the bulk of the load at home
- there were differences in the amount of unpaid work male respondents thought their female partners did and the number of hours of unpaid work reported by female respondents.

APEC

The Ministry will virtually host the first 'set' of officials meetings for the APEC Policy Partnership on Women and the Economy next week (25-27 May 2021). These meetings will cover implementation progress on the La Serena Roadmap and initial discussions on the Women and Economy Forum (WEF) statement that you will deliver, as host, at the meeting in September this year. It will also include a Policy Dialogue focused on increasing inclusion and sustainability, with women and girls at the heart of COVID-19 recovery efforts. Representatives from APEC economies will be sharing information on successful initiatives, and identifying barriers, challenges and approaches that work to embed inclusive actions. These meetings include representatives from economies across the APEC group, and are spread out across three sessions over three days.

We will update you on progress and the delivery of these sessions in the week following (commencing 31 May 2021).
